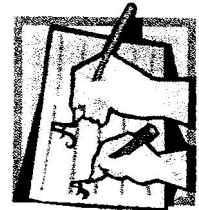

PRESCHOOL

1. A decorated rock.
2. Make a macaroni picture.
3. Paper plate "face" creation (person or animal)
4. Paper bag puppet
5. Painting - any painted picture
6. Any creative design using a variety of recycled items.
(Maximum height not to exceed 40 cm.)
7. Open class - any flat or 3-D item that will stand on a shelf.



KINDERGARTEN (Year 1/Year 2):

1. Printing - Print the sentence "I can _____." and draw a picture of you and what you can do. (8.5 x11" paper)
2. Fun with Flowers – any flower designs. (fun foam, cupcake papers, painted, - be creative!
3. Creations by Colour Mixing (Paper size not to exceed 60x90cm)
4. What can I make with my handprint?
5. Painting - any painted picture.
6. Make a picture using recycled items (be creative!)
7. Any creative design using a variety of recycled items.
(Maximum height not to exceed 40 cm.)
8. Open class – any flat or 3-D item that will stand on a shelf.



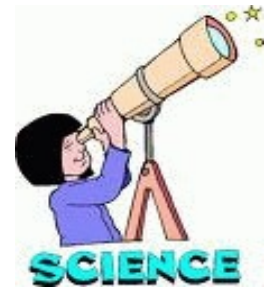
Grade 1, 2, 3:

1. Fabulous Frames – create a picture frame and decorate –



(cardboard can be used for base & decorated)

2. My best printing - names of seven vegetables
3. Lots of Labels – Draw a picture and label the picture
4. Math Activity – Any work demonstrating a particular math related concept – (please indicate concept on exhibit tag).
5. Story Book Picture – Student drawn picture (on 8 ½ x 11 size paper) taken from their favourite story book (attach photocopy of story book picture for comparison/judging).
6. Picture Making – any child drawn picture using any medium on flat paper (any size).
7. Project – any Science/Health/Social Studies project: may include poster, diorama, or model small enough to sit on a shelf.
8. French Activity - Draw a picture and title it “La Foire” - label parts of your picture in French
8. Open class – any flat or 3-D work no larger than above sizes.



Grade 4, 5, 6:

1. Best Handwriting –Your top 10 list of favourite things!
2. Design a CD cover (to be displayed in a CD case holder)
3. Story – First page has picture and title, second page – typed or written story.
4. Math Activity – Any work demonstrating a particular math related concept – (please indicate concept on exhibit tag).
5. Poetry – any creative writing piece composed by the student ex. limericks, verses, haiku etc....
6. French Activity -Acrostic poem using the “La Foire” and illustrate.
7. Project – any Science/Health/Social Studies project: may include poster, diorama, or model small enough to sit on a shelf.
8. Sculpting – using any medium ex. paper mache, clay, etc.
9. Open class – any flat or 3-D work no larger than above sizes



Grade 7, 8:

10. Original poem of 8-12 lines composed by the student, on a sheet of foolscap, mounted on construction paper.
11. Picture making – any hand drawn human figure showing action using any medium on flat paper (any size).
12. Penmanship – Write a list of your top 10 favourite things!
13. Design a CD cover (to be displayed in a CD case holder)
14. Project – any Science/Health/ Social Studies Project: may include poster, diorama, or model small enough to sit on a shelf.
15. French Activity – Hailu Poem related to “La Foire” inside (birthday, get well etc... - be creative)
16. Math Activity – Any work demonstrating a particular math related concept – (please

17. Open class – any flat or 3-D work no larger than above size requirements.

Special Education/Alternative Learning

Primary Division (Up to 9 years of age)

1. Sewing – any hand made article sewn by the student ex. stuffed animal, table runner, pillow/cushion, sachet, clothing items etc.
2. Wood working - Any wooden article crafted by the student. ex. birdhouses, plaques, door hangings, trivets, toolboxes etc.
3. Picture Making - any student drawn picture using any medium on flat paper (paper size not to exceed 60X90 cm)
4. Project -any Science/Health/Social Studies project: may include poster, diorama, or model small enough to sit on a shelf.
5. Open – any creation made by the student that does not fit into the above categories. ex crafts, wreaths, sculpting, etc.



Junior Division (10 – 13 years old)

1. Sewing – any hand made article sewn by the student ex. stuffed animal, table runner, pillow/cushion, sachet, clothing items etc.
2. Wood working - Any wooden article crafted by the student. ex. birdhouses, plaques, door hangings, trivets, toolboxes, etc.
