6. You may only enter one (1) item in each Class for your age group.
7. You may compete with an age group above yours, but you may not compete against a younger group.
8. Any Exhibitor found cheating will not receive any prizes or prize money.
9. All exhibits must be new work.

11. If you win a special or prize money, you may pick it up at the Secretary's Office on Sunday or Monday of the Fair.

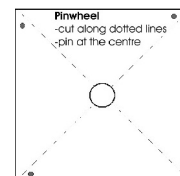

30. Light'em Up! Paint and decorate pudding cups, punch a hole in the bottom of cups and display your covers on a string of Christmas Lights!

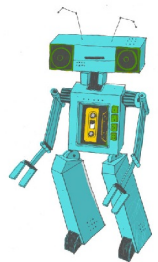
